Helen wanted to continue to teach the Gospel, so she became active in the Friendship House benevolent ministry at her church. Sympathizing with their brokenness, she teaches the hope of the Gospel to women who have been domestically abused and men who are downtrodden. She tells them how much God loves them and has a plan for their lives. **Recently, Helen reported that she has led 26 women and six men to the Lord in the last year!**
