In July 2012, God called my wife and me to Cypress, Texas, to pastor Grace Life Baptist Church, an independent Baptist church. We only had 11 members, so I started going door to door, inviting people to our revitalization.

My very first week, I knocked on the door of a retired couple who had just completed an interim pastor assignment at a church in Houston. They were looking for their new church home. Although they had never been members of an independent Baptist church, God knit my wife's heart and my heart to Oscar and Terri Gonzales.

That initial knock at the door began an 11-year friendship that continues to this day. Oscar and Terri became our biggest supporters, cheerleaders and prayer warriors. Even though Terri would say to me from time to time, "You know the Convention has so many positive benefits! Missions. Missions. Missions. The sense of encouragement from fellow pastors and churches who are trying to accomplish the same task: preaching the Gospel and making disciples."

Over our many conversations, I learned of a ministry that Oscar and Terri had come to support and also receive support from: Mission:Dignity®. On more than one occasion, Oscar would say to me, "Brother Joel, God is so good and so faithful to us. I received my monthly support check from Mission:Dignity." Believing in Miracles



Deuteronomy 10:21

We often find ourselves on our knees praying for a miracle, trying to have faith that the Lord will provide, but it can be difficult to keep our eyes open to see the miracles God performs. I have been blessed to be on the receiving end of several miracles myself, none greater than in my youngest son's life. In 1967, when I was only two months pregnant with our youngest son, my appendix burst. The doctors who prepared me for emergency surgery informed us there was little they would be able to do to save the baby while saving my life. Having previously lost a child, this news was devastating. But my husband and I believed in the power of prayer and knew God had the power to save us both.

We hit our knees and put our lives in the Lord's hands.

During surgery, while the doctors worked to clean out the infected tissues, a pediatrician held my uterus in a warm towel to keep the baby safe before placing it back in my body. Five days later, I was cleared to go home to my husband and son, with a baby still growing in my womb. That very night, I was rushed back to the hospital with a severe gallbladder attack they could do nothing about until the baby was born. I spent my days drinking bottle after bottle of milk of magnesia. As the baby grew and moved, I became more ill, and my 4-year-old son had to learn how to care for me, frequently wiping my brow with a cool cloth. But God performed a miracle, and our baby was born full term. Unfortunately, he had lungs full of amniotic fluid, and it was 24 hours before he was able to breathe on his own. But he pulled through, and God granted him his health.

Soon after, my gallbladder was removed, and that surgery helped to restore my health.

Four years later, the Lord would save our youngest son's life once more when a severe case of chicken pox turned inward, and his fever rose so high that he fell into a coma. When his fever broke, I cried in relief. We truly thought we would lose him. It is so hard to see your children go through so much, especially in their young lives. But God is always good and always provides peace and guidance.

When it feels like it is all falling apart, we need to remember that God is still a miracle worker.

Deuteronomy 10:21 says, *"He alone is your God, the only one who is worthy of your praise, the one who has done these mighty miracles that you have seen with your own eyes."*
